Together we will explore Talmudic sugyot in an innovative fashion, combining historical and academic approaches with an eye towards revealing the existential dimensions of this foundational Jewish text (open to beginners and advanced learners).

Rav Hutner learned in Slobodka and in Eretz Yisrael with Rav Kook and then established the Chaim Berlin Yeshiva in Brooklyn. His teachings show his virtuosity in melding Halacha and Machshava. These teaching will deepen our understanding of each of the Moadim as they approach.

In recent years, Rebbe Nachman of Breslov has become increasingly influential in both the Religious community and Israeli society as a whole. We will explore his thought and the way it is understood by Rav Shagar. In Rebbe Nachman, Rav Shagar sees a model for renewing the language and theology of Torah in our turbulent age.
- Modern, Post-Modern and Off-Modern Jewish Thought. Between Chassidut and Philosophy**
We will understand the Jewish experience in a world where Jewish practice is individualistic and everything is relative. We will explore traditional texts through the lens of Rav Shagar, Rav Fruman, Rav Steinsaltz, Svetlana Boym and others.
